USDA DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY: WHEAT AND CORN PRICES CONTINUED STRONG, WED-NESDAY, ON ACTIVE EXPORT BUSI-NESS; CASH SOYBEAN PRICES WEAKENED ON GOOD HARVEST ACTIVITY. WHEAT 3 TO 10 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 1 TO 2 CENTS HIGH-ER. SORGHUM 2 TO 3 CENTS HIGH-ER. SOYBEANS 2 TO 3 CENTS LOWER TO 1 CENT HIGHER. MODERATE EXPORT BUSINESS WITH PHILIP-PINES, AFRICAN COUNTRIES, VENE-ZUELA, BRAZIL, RUSSIA, JAPAN AND EGYPT, FACTOR IN HIGHER GRAIN PRICES. RUSSIA IS **REPORTED TO HAVE BID ON 1.6 MIL-**LION TONNES U.S. SOFT RED WINT-ER WHEAT, UNDER EXPORT ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM. USDA. THIS MORNING, REJECTED EGYPT'S WHEAT BID FOR 290,000 TONNES BUT ARE EXPECTED TO REBID SOON. HIGHER WHEAT PRICES ALSO ADDED TO CORN PRICE UPTURNS. LATE CORN HARVEST SLOWED FARMER SELLING AND MANY HOLDING ON TO CROPS UNTIL PRICES CLIMB HIGHER. CASH SOYBEAN PRICES DECLINED SLIGHTLY AS GOOD WEATHER ALLOWING STEADY HARVEST ACTIVITY. GRAINS INSPECTED FOR EXPORT FOR WEEK ENDING 10/08/92: WHEAT TOTALED 30.8 MIL-LION BUSHELS, UP 4.0, CORN 35.3, UP 5.5 MILLION BUSHELS, AND SOY-BEANS 17.3, UP 8.5 COMPARED TO A WEEK AGO. YEAR TO DATE: WHEAT 405.1, DOWN 4.9, CORN 191.8, UP 3.8, AND SOYBEANS 72.7, UP 27.2. Trade sentiment was steady on all but

the light weights which were fully steady to firm. Demand was fair to good, best where featured. Supplies were mostly adequate to instances tight for the light sizes


