n October 24th, 1861, Stephen Johnson Field, chief justice of California, sent a message informing President Abraham Lincoln in Washington that the East and West coasts of United States were linked for the first time by telegraph at Fort Bridger, Utah The transcontinental telegraph had been approved by Congress in 1860 On October 25th another exchange of messages took place between Mayor Fernando Wood of New York and Mayor HF Teschemacher of San Fransisco The rates were \$1 a word the first week and then reduced to \$6 for ten words, and any additional words were 75¢ each
