Trucklot buying interest was very light. Supplies of boneless skinless breasts were irregularly distributed. Most buyers were quite cautious. The trade sentiment was barely steady at best. Line run breasts were available at some locations and slow to clear but overall supplito short of covering buyer inquiries. Wings, legs, leg quarters, and drumsticks were in fairly good balance with current needs and trading was reported at steady prices.

GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES LOWER ON EXPORT DISAPPOINTMENT AND ACTIVE CORN AND BEAN HARVEST. WHEAT 1 TO 4 CENTS LOWER. CORN 1 TO 4 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 3 TO 8 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 1 TO 5 CENTS LOWER. RUSSIA'S WHEAT BID WAS REJECTED FOR THE FIFTH TIME BY USDA. PUSHING WHEAT PRICES DOWN FURTHER. PRICE DECINES WERE LIMITED, HOWEVER, ON GOOD FOREIGN DEMAND FROM AFRICA AND PHILIPPINES. ACTIVE CORN AND BEAN HARVEST IN MIDWEST ADDED PRESSURE TO PRICES. CORN HARVEST IS AROUND 22 PERCENT COMPLETE COMPARED TO 63 PERCENT A YEAR AGO; BEANS 62 PERCENT COMPARED TO 65 PERCENT LAST SEASON. REPORTS CHINA WANTS TO REJOIN GATT ALSO WEAKENED PRICES. CORN PRICES WERE UNDERPINNED BY INDICATIONS UKRAINE IS SEEKING 620,000 TONNES U.S. CORN.

EXPORT NEWS: WESTERN AND CENTRAL AFRICAN NATIONS BOUGHT 140,500 TONNES HARD RED SPRING WHEAT, UNDER EEP. THE PHILIPPINES BOUGHT 93,950 TONNES U.S. WHEAT, UNDER EEP. TAIWAN BOUGHT 32,000 TONNES U.S. NO. 2 YELLOW SOYBEANS FOR NOV/DEC.
