**HARRY HOUDINI DIED, OCTOBER 31, 1926.**

Harry Houdini, born on March 24, 1874, as Ehrich Weiss in Budapest, Hungary, died October 31, 1926, from complications from a ruptured appendix. On October 22 Houdini met with three students in his dressing room. One was an amateur boxer who mistakenly thought he could test Houdini's tolerance to blows to the stomach. Unfortunately Houdini didn't have time to tense his abdominal muscles. The following night during a show in Detroit, he suffered from stomach cramps and fever. Later he collapsed on stage and was taken to a Detroit hospital where he died on Halloween morning. He was buried in his bronze "buried alive" stunt coffin next to his beloved mother.

**SWEET AND SOUR MEATBALLS**

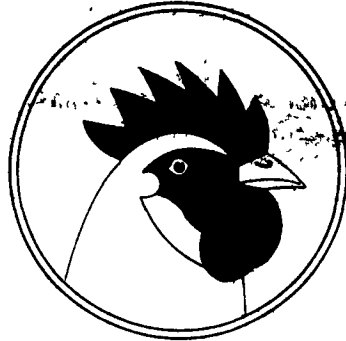
- 1 1/2 pounds ground beef
- 1 cup bread crumbs
- 1 egg
- 3 teaspoons beef bouillon, divided
- 1 tablespoon chopped parsley
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1 cup apricot preserves
- 1 tablespoon sweet relish

Make 1-inch meatballs using beef, crumbs, egg, and 2 teaspoons of bouillon. Brown in a skillet. Remove meatballs and pour off fat. Add remaining ingredients to skillet and cook over low heat for 15 minutes, stirring often. Add meatballs, cover, and simmer for 10 minutes.

Makes 48 meatballs.

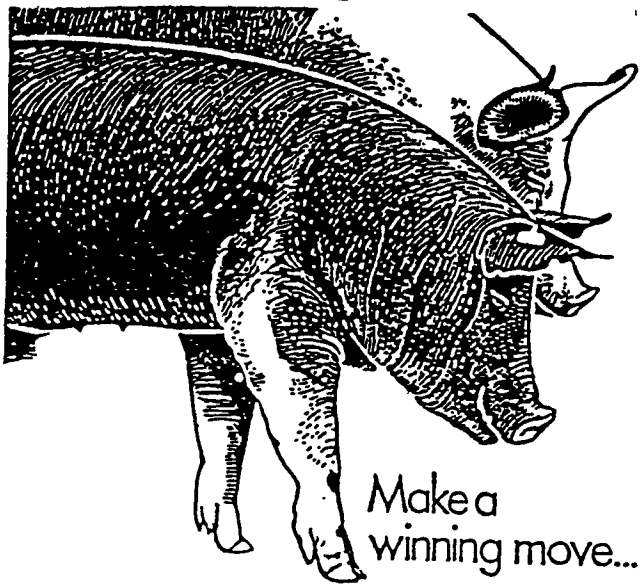

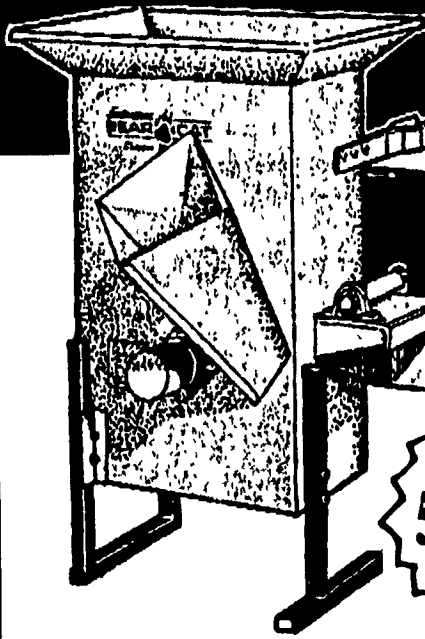
