

#### HARRY HOUDINI DIED, OCTOBER 31, 1926,

arry Houdini, born on March 24, 1874, as Ehrich Weiss in Budapest, Hungary, died October 31, 1926, from complications from a ruptured appendix. On October 22 Houdini met with three students in his dressing room. One was an amateur boxer who mistakenly thought he could test Houdini's tolerance to blows to the stomach. Unfortunately Houdini didn't have time to tense his abdominal muscles. The following night during a show in Detroit, he suffered from stomach cramps and fever. Later he collapsed on stage

and was taken to a Detroit hospital where he died on Halloween morning. He was buried in his bronze "buried alive" stunt coffin next to his beloved mother.


