Kuhn, along with 15 others, was named master gardener recently during the 78th annual meeting of the Penn State cooperative extension of Berks County.

Some of the natives watched with a puzzled eye, Kuhn said, and not many spoke English.

"We got by by smiling and bowing," Kuhn said with a laugh. "It was fun."


Most master gardener candidates don't have to travel halfway around the world to do their service projects, said Judith L. Schwank, extension director, but volunteering is part of the course, wherever it takes them.

Kenneth E. Herb Gebely, manager of the Kutztown Produce Auction, spoke on the 3-year-old business that enables farmers to sell their pro-






