 caused by game and set up the following criteria:

- that additional revenues be raised and used to establish a fund to pay for documented deer damage to farmers;
- that a reimbursement schedule be implemented to pay farmers for damage by game;
- that a farmer harvesting deer for crop damage be permitted to donate to others outside the farm the meat resulting from harvest;

d. and that farmers harvesting at night receive the same confidentiality given to alleged game law informants.

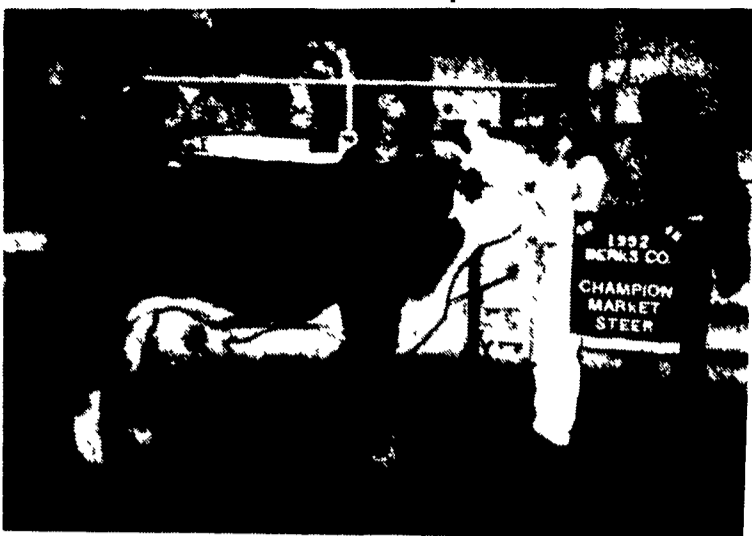
7. We recommend that the Mifflin County School District offer the Hunter's Safety Course Program as part of the Mifflin County School District curriculum.
