Live supplies were moderate. Weights varied in a full range. Slaughter schedules were heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 53 to 62 cents. Trade sentiment was steady but cautious. In parts complex, leg items were in best balance. Breast items were in closer balance, particularly bone-in which were tight in some instances. Wings were fully adequate.
