USDA DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY PROFIT TAKING ON THE BOARD AND INTERMITTENT HARVEST PROGRESS DROVE GRAIN PRICES LOWER, WEDNESDAY. WHEAT 4 TO 7 CENTS LOWER. CORN UNCHANGED TO 3 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 3 TO 6 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 2 TO 4 CENTS LOWER. WHEAT PRICES FELL MODERATELY AS RUSSIA'S U.S. WHEAT BID WAS AGAIN REJECTED BY USDA. SUBSTANTIAL ORDER TO CHINA STILL STANDING BUT ONCE THESE TWO ORDERS FILLED, OUTLOOK FOR LARGE VOLUME EXPORT SALES RATHER DIM. CORN AND BEAN PRICES UNDER PRESSURE AS COMBINES MOVING BACK INTO CORN FIELDS.

EXPORT NEWS: CHINA BOUGHT 205,000 METRIC TONS SOFT RED WINTER WHEAT FOR 92/93 MARKETING YEAR. JAPAN BOUGHT 56,200 TONNES WHEAT FOR JANUARY SHIPMENT. SRI LANKA BOUGHT 49,750 TONNES HARD RED WINTER WHEAT, UNDER EEP, FOR NOVEMBER. USDA COMMODITY CREDIT CORP BOUGHT 20,550 TONNES U.S. HARD RED WINTER WHEAT TO DONATE TO KENYA FOR NOV/DEC SHIPMENT.
