 OKLAHOMA NATIONAL STOCKYARDS WEEKLY CATTLE SUMMARY: Compared to last week: Steer and heifer calves \$2.00-\$4.00 higher. Yearling steers steady to \$1.00 lower. Yearling heifers steady to \$2.00 lower. Feedlot demand for yearlings moderate. Calf demand good and greatly improved over past month. Buyers became more active as weekend storms provided needed moisture to a portion of Oklahoma wheat pastures. Western sector wheat remains dry as rains, thus far, have missed that area. Quality of calves average to attractive with average to thin condition and moderately full weigh-ups. Number of 30-45 day weaned calves improving steadily with this week the best since fall run began. Quality and condition of yearlings average with fill condition continuing average to full. Slaughter cows closed steady. Late cow demand good. Slaughter bulls \$1.00 lower. Bull demand moderate. Receipts this week 8,000; last week 9,039; last year 7,609. Supply consisted of 51% yearlings; 38% calves; 11% cows and bulls. Bulk prices follow; weighted average prices in parenthesis:
