**EARTHWISE**

If you're buying new tires before the season of ice and snow gets underway, here are some things to consider. Radial tires result in the best gas mileage, and steel-belted radials are usually the most efficient. Keep your tires properly inflated — underinflation can waste up to 5% of a car's fuel due to increased rolling resistance. Patronize a dealer who will recycle your old tires. They may charge a few dollars for the service, but the dump will charge you too, and the cost to the environment is much greater at the dump.

**SPLIT PEA SOUP**

- 3 cups split peas
- 3 quarts water
- 3 carrots, chopped
- 2 sticks celery, chopped
- 1 sweet potato, peeled and chopped
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon basil
- 1/2 teaspoon marjoram
- 1/2 teaspoon cumin
- 1/2 teaspoon thyme

Rinse peas. Bring peas and water to boil in large pot. While peas cook, chop vegetables. Add remaining ingredients and simmer for 2 hours or until done, adding water as needed. Makes about 4 quarts.

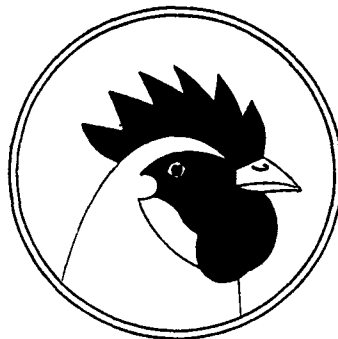

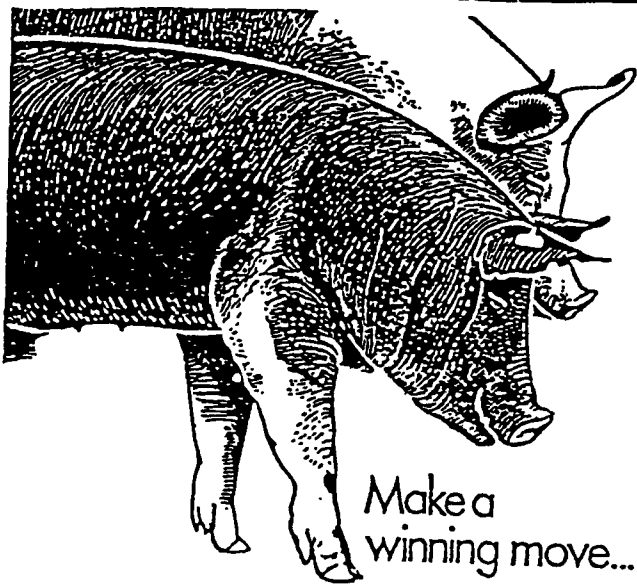

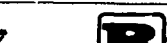
