magine traveling by rail in the 'good old days" Each railroad scheduled arrivals and departures in terms of the par-Iticular city and each city set its own time standard (usually based on the sun's position over city hall) A cross country traveler had to adjust his watch 20 times to keep pace with the local variations! On arrival, the traveler wouldn't know if he was 'on time or not, since the time could vary by 30 minutes or more at different rail stations. All this changed on November 18 1883 when the rulroads adopted Standard Time Charles Ferdinand Dowd labored for 13 years to convince the American Railroad Association to try his time plan and although the railroads and the American people benefit ed greatly. Professor Dowd is largely untemembered
