

BESSEMER STEEL

ecember 5, 1865, marked a turning point for American engincering. On that day Sir Honry Bessemer received an American patent for his method of converting iron to steel using a blast of air to burn out the impurities - the Bessemer process. The resulting metal was harder than wrought iron and less brittle than cast iron. Bessemer's work laid the foundation for important technological advances with the provision of steel of known and uniform characteris tics. The higher tensile strength Bessemer steel was in demand for fails for the expanding failroad system, boilers, piston rods crankshafts bridges and shipbuilding Bessemer steel changed the shape of the growing country




