Slaughter schedules increased and were heavy overall. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 52 to 62 cents, but were highly negotiable. Trade sentiment was barely steady to lower. In the parts complex, leg quarters were in close balance. Breast items were fully adequate to ample. Wings were irregularly balanced; however, overall demand had slowed.

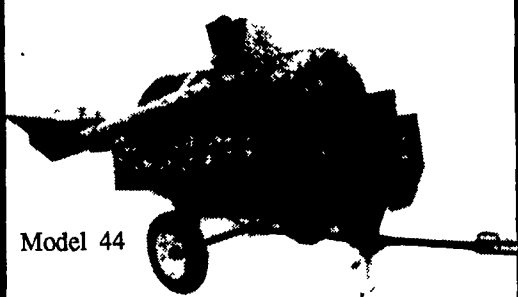

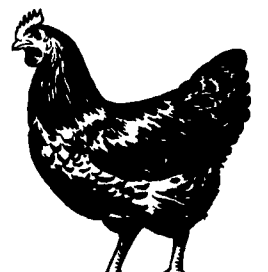
