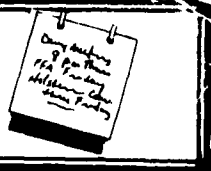

Maryland Tobacco Auctions Begin March 16

ANNAPOLIS, Md. — The 1993 Maryland Tobacco auction season will begin March 16 and will last during a four-week season, closing April 8, according to

Maryland Secretary of Agriculture Robert L. Walker.

Walker's announcement follows recommendations of the State Tobacco Authority, which proposed the sales dates after consulting with tobacco buyers, warehouse managers, and growers.

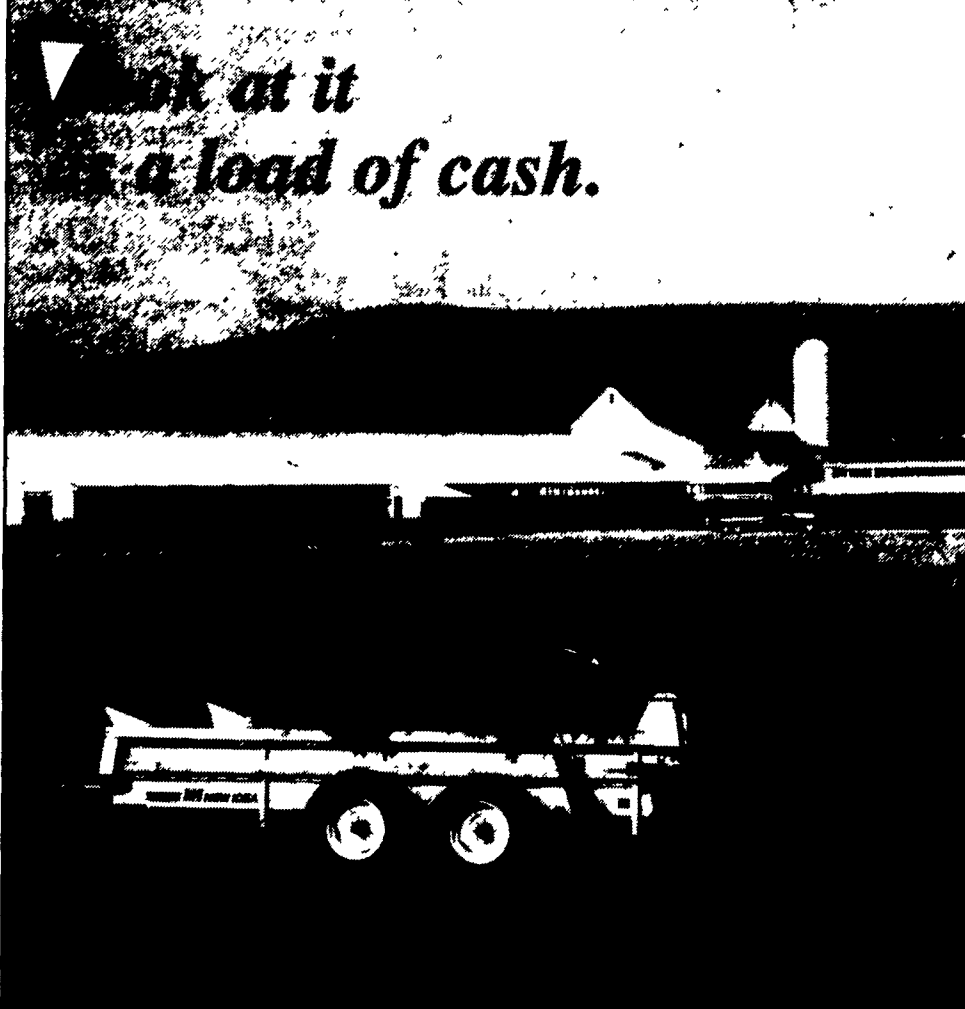
Running over a four week period, the 1993 sales will be held on 15 days.

Sales will be held at the six public warehouses located at Wayson's Corner, Waldorf, two at Upper Marlboro, and two at Hughesville.

The Maryland Department of Agriculture's Marketing Services will provide daily sales reports during the season over its "Tobacco Report" toll-free number. Those interested in following the market can access the report after 8:30 a.m. each day by calling (800) 638-2207.

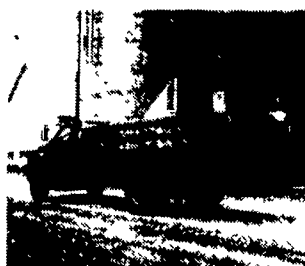

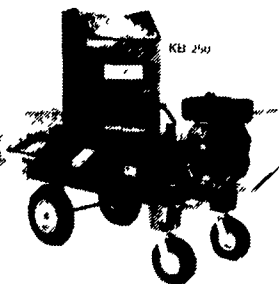
