of standing corn a few days before Christmas.

This is so because farmers, in an effort for maximum production, planted a late maturing corn variety.

Because of a lack of sun and heat during the past summer, the maturity was too late. Not too pragmatic!

They produced more, yes. But the price dropped and some spoiled.

Who wins?

The next unanswered question: if the increase in production density is promoted and a decrease in cropland results, what do we do with the farmers who are

displaced?

Do we put them on welfare? If we do, from where does the money come to pay the welfare?

Certainly some of the changes predicted by Mr. Sharrer will slowly come about, to a lesser degree perhaps, but don't sell the farm!

There are still much more important matters for science to solve than increasing corn density to 3-inch, by 3-inch stands. For instance, it would seem more important to come up with a much more efficient method of producing electricity.
