Slaughter cows firm to \$3.00 higher. Holiday season disrupted cow markets resulted in wide swings in demand. Opening cow trade very active and sharply higher; later declines ending in dull close. Slaughter bulls steady. Receipts this week 2,650; last week 5,525; last year 483 head. Run 55% yearlings or big calves over 600 lbs.; 30% calves under 600 lbs.; 15% cows and bulls.
