**HANSEL MONDAY**

According to old Scottish custom, the first Monday of the new year was the time to give children and servants a small gift. Literally, something given into the hands of someone else, the gift itself was less important than the good luck it betokened. The handsel was popular as a New Year's gift from the fourteenth century to the nineteenth century, but it had a broader application as a gift given to mark any new situation not just the new year. The handsel continues today in the tradition of presenting a housewarming gift to bring good luck into the new home.

**TIP OF THE WEEK**

You can easily remove the wax drips from your candlesticks if you put them in the freezer overnight.

**EARTHWISE**

Winter is a good time for indoor crafts. If your project involves using glue, here are some safety tips. Try using hot vinegar to remove old glue. It will often soften the glue so it can be scraped off. Carpenter's glue and water-based white glue are the safest to use. Many others contain toxins that are very harmful to the environment. If you must use nonwater-based glues, use a small fan to blow the fumes out a partially open window, otherwise they can become highly concentrated inside your house in a very short time.

**CHICKEN CASSEROLE**

- 2 10-ounce packages frozen broccoli
- 3 cups cooked chicken
- 2 cans cream of chicken soup
- 1 cup light mayonnaise
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 1/2 teaspoon curry powder
- 8 ounces cheddar cheese, shredded
- 1 tablespoon melted butter
- 1/2 cup soft bread crumbs

Cook broccoli until tender and arrange in greased 3-quart casserole. Place chicken on top of broccoli. Combine next 4 ingredients and pour over the chicken. Sprinkle on the cheese. Combine butter and crumbs and sprinkle on top. Bake at 350° F for 25 to 30 minutes.

Makes 6 to 8 servings.

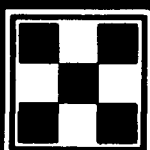

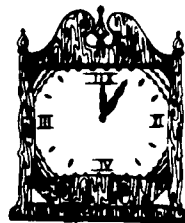
