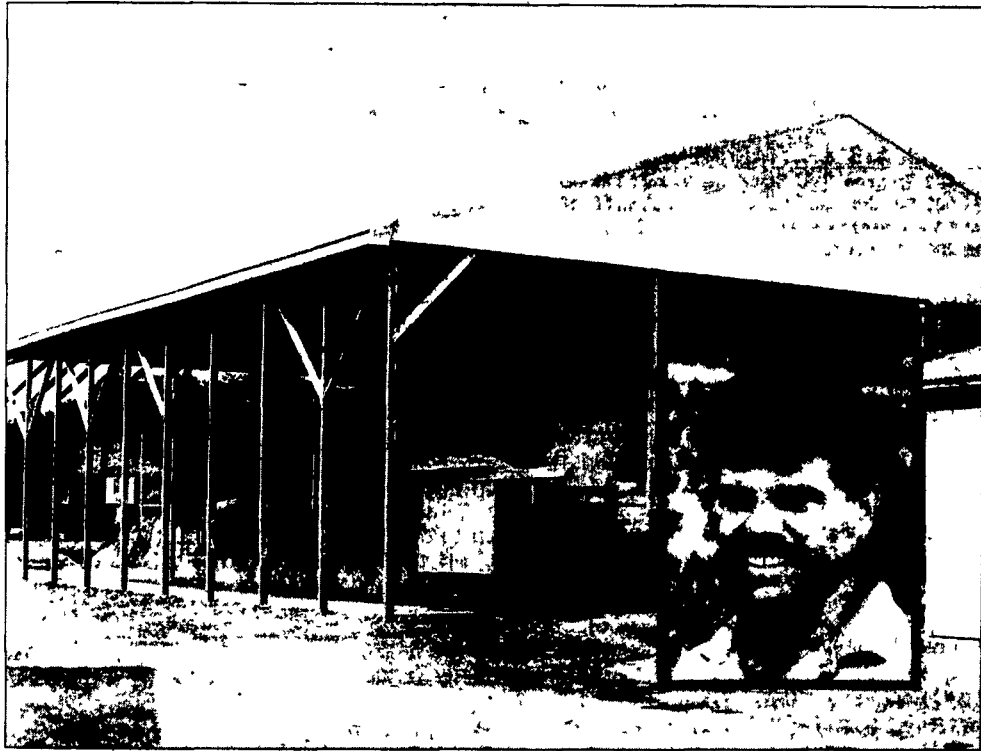

surface water protection. Our containment systems ensure protection."

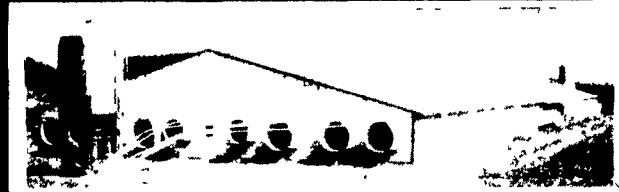

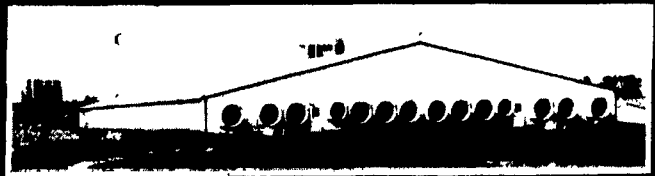

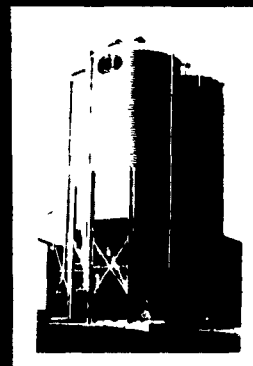


700 Sow Feeder Pig Unit

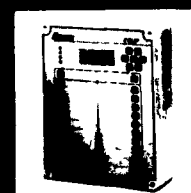
