Erinn R. Middleton

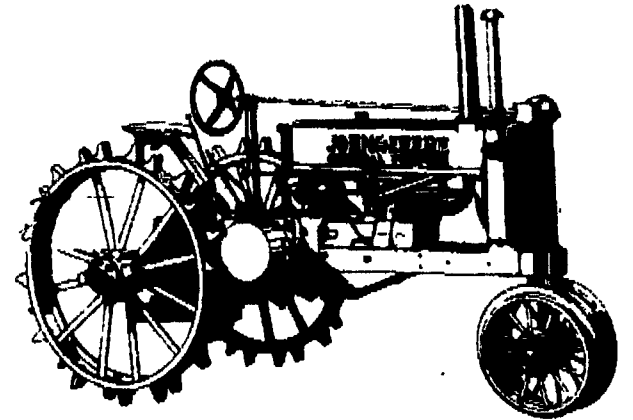

Barn's in Lancaster and surrounding counties are runned by overcoating.
