## PA Fair Association To Meet

HERSHEY (Dauphin Co.) — The 81st Annual Convention of the Pennsylvania State Association of County Fairs will be held in conjunction with the Pennsylvania

State Showmen's Association in Hershey, January 21-23, 1993.

Headquarters for the Convention will be the Hershey Lodge and Convention Center in

Hershey, PA. Over 1500 fair people, from 115 agricultural fairs in Pennsylvania, with some additional representatives from neighboring states, will be in

attendance. A large trade show representing all segments of the fair and entertainment industry will also be a part of the Convention.

Keynote speaker will be Mr. Gordon Conklin of Ithaca, New York, Editor Emeritus of the American Agriculturalist Magazine, a leading farm paper in the Northeast. A graduate of Cornell University, Mr. Conklin has received many awards at the national level.

Educational sessions and workshops will be available to assist fair people. Friday evening will be the Fairmen's Banquet, and Saturday evening will be the Showmen's Banquet. Also on the agenda is the selection of the 1993 PA State Fair Queen, chosen from among 40 girls representing their fairs. Also featured will be the honoring of a Fair Person of the year, a President's Award, and the election of new officers.

Present officers of the Association are: A. Wayne Readinger of Fleetwood, President, Fr. John Mignot of DuBois, Vice President/Chaplain, and Beverly Snyder Gruber of New Tripoli, Secretary-Treasurer. In addition, the Association has a 25 member executive committee.
