CORN 1 TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM UNCHANGED TO 2 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 2 TO 7 CENTS HIGHER. WHEAT PRICES CONTINUED TO INCH UPWARD ON HOPES REPORTS CHINA MAY BE SEEKING U.S. WHEAT ARE TRUE. 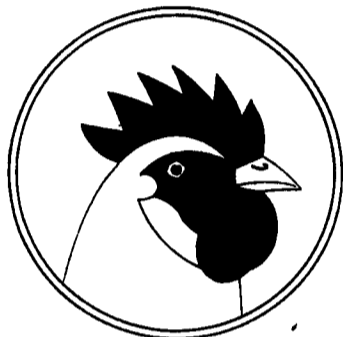

Trucklot buying interest slowed somewhat from the aggressive pace noted yesterday. Supplies of boneless skinless breasts were in good balance with a fair retail demand. Trading was reported at higher prices but some buyer resistance started to show at the new price levels. Line run breasts continued short of covering immediate needs but some buyers are fully booked into late week and a cautious undertone was noted. Yellow skin leg quarters started to show at some locations by mid-morning. Wings were extremely tight and buying inquiries for trucklot volumes went unfulfilled. The trade sentiment continued firm.
