VERY GOOD OUTLOOK FOR EXPORT WHEAT BUSINESS SUPPORTED WHEAT PRICES, WEDNESDAY; CORN PRICES FELL IN REACTION TO YESTERDAY'S USDA CROP PRODUCTION AND GRAIN STOCKS REPORT; BEAN PRICES MIXED. WHEAT 3 TO 6 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 1 TO 2 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 1 TO 5 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS MIXED FROM 1 TO 2 CENTS LOWER TO 1 TO 4 CENTS HIGHER. WHEAT PRICES REGAINED EARLIER LOSSES ON PROMISING EXPORT OUTLOOK INCLUDING CHINA AND FORMER USSR. ALL WHEAT PRODUCTION FOR 1992 WAS ESTIMATED AT 2.46 BILLION BUSHELS, UP 24 PERCENT FROM LAST YEAR, WINTER WHEAT CROP WAS ESTIMATED AT 1.61 BILLION BUSHELS, UP 17 PERCENT, CLOSE TO EXPECTATIONS. CORN PRICES DOWN SLIGHTLY DUE TO USDA'S ESTIMATE OF 1992 CORN FOR GRAIN PRODUCTION AT A RECORD HIGH 9.48 BILLION BUSHELS, UP 27 PERCENT FROM 1991 AND 2 PERCENT ABOVE NOVEMBER ESTIMATE BEANS WERE ESTIMATED AT 2.20 BILLION BUSHELS IN 1992, UP 11 PERCENT FROM YEAR AGO AND 1 PERCENT ABOVE NOVEMBER FORECAST. SEVERAL TENDERS ON EXPORT BOOKS BUT NOTHING SUBSTANTIAL.
