NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE: Prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady in the Northeast and Midwest, steady to fully steady in the South and on the West Coast. Demand ranged light to instances good, mostly fair, and best where featured. Supplies were generally adequate with occasional shortages in the South. Extra eggs continued to be held with confidence except for some surplus jumbos offered in the Midwest at steady to lower prices. Breaking stock supplies were closely balanced to adequate, and prices were unchanged to higher. Light type hen markets were steady to firm, mostly fully steady with offerings usually short to instances balanced with the moderate to good demand.
