AGA Announces National Leaders

KEYNOLDSBURG, Ohio — The American Guernsey Association has released the following list of cows for achieving national class leader status during the third quarter of 1992.

Pine Grove Fayette Emerald "Emerald" is a Dutch Mill Telestars Fayette daughter with 25,7890 pounds of milk, 3.7 percent or 943 pounds of fat, and 3.1 percent, or 809 pounds of protein in 305 days during a lactation started at 3-years, 10 months.

Her national class leading record earned her fifth place for milk in 305 days in the senior 3-year-old division. She has a July 1992 USDA PTA of +1,244M +17F +\$114 +26P +\$97P.

Her dam, Fauver Hill Trans Electra, has 15,680 pounds of milk with 3.8 percent, 602 pounds of fat, and 3.1 percent, 488 pounds of protein. She made that as a junior 5-year-old in 305 days. The breeder is Bernard Pralle, Onalaska, Wis., and the owner is David Williams, of LaFarge, Wis.

Laeschland Fayette Bianca "Bianca" is a 93-point Dutch Mill Telestars Fayette daughter that made 29,250 pounds of milk with components of 4 percent, or 1,173 pounds of fat, and 3.2 percent, or 929 pounds, of protein. She made that as a 4-year-old in 365 days.

Her national class leading record earned her second place for milk in 305 days in the senior 4-year-old division. Her CPI is +251 and PTAT is +2.8. She has a July 1992 USDA PTA of +1,292M +33F +\$135 +37P +\$129P.

Her dam, the 88-point GR Laeschland FN Bambi, posted a lactation record as a 3-year-old of 16,330 pounds of milk, 4.8 percent, or 790 pounds of fat, and 3.6 percent, or 593 pounds of protein in 310 days. The breeder and owner is Phil Laesch, of Curtiss, Wis. Twin L Farms Fayette Farrah

"Farrah" is a 90-point Dutch Mill Telestars Fayette daughter with 27,610 pounds of milk, 4.5 percent, 1,236 pounds of fat, and 3.2 percent, 885 pounds of protein. That was made in 365 days at 3-02.

In the junior 3-year-old division, her national class leading record earned her ninth place for milk in 365 days. She has a July 1992 USDA PTA of \pm 1,690M \pm 71F \pm 205 \pm 49P \pm 198P, and is \pm 368 for CPI and \pm 3.0 PTAT.

As a 5-year-old, her dam, the 88-point Twin L. Farms Volcano Fern, a gold star dam, made 22,580 pounds of milk with 4.3 percent, 979 pounds of fat, and 3.2 percent, 727 pounds of protein in 365 days. Breeder and owner is Jack Krull, Bonduel, Wis.

O C S Dairy Daisys Diadora "Diadora," a 90-point Spring Walk B T Frank daughter, has a first lactation 365-day record 24,080 pounds of milk with 4.9 percent, 1,180 pounds of fat, and 3.5 percent, 849 pounds of protein. She earned seventh place status for fat in 365 days in the junior 2-yearold class to receive her national class leader ranking.


