Farmer Tops In Sorghum Yield

DEKALB, Ill. — Greg Manners of Ringoes, N.J. won a state first-place award in the National Grain Sorghum Producers (NGSP) yield and management contest, nonirrigated division.

He will be honored by DeKalb Plant Genetics at a reception during the NGSP convention Feb. 14-16 in St. Louis. Manners also will receive special recognition from the NGSP. He won the award with a DeKalb sorghum hybrid.

Manners planted DK48 seed

which produced 81.13 bushels per acre. This yield ranked him among DeKalb's 22 national and state first-place winners. He planted his crop on May 30, 1992 in 20-inch rows and harvested it on Nov. 20.

To qualify for the award, contestants were scored against the five-year average established for his county by the Crop Reporting Service. Winners are those producers whose yields were highest in relation to the county average.


Manners, who has been farming 20 years, grows 700 acres of sorg-

hum, wheat, soybeans, rye, oats, hay, pumpkins, and corn. He also raises cattle and hogs.

DeKalb sorghum hybrids won national first and second place awards in the irrigated division and a national third place in the nonirrigated division.

In state results, DeKalb hybrids won 22 of 38 yield and management contests, more than double the winners of any other seed company and more than all other companies combined.
