

Ohio Corn Grower Director To Address Conference



WEST MIDDLESEX (Mercer Co.) — Mike Wagner, the executive director of the Ohio Corn Growers Association, will be one of the featured speakers at this year's annual corn conference.

The conference is slated to be held on March 2 at the Ramada Inn in West Middlesex in Mercer County. The conference will feature presentations on a number of timely topics, presentation of the Five Acre Corn Club Awards, and industry exhibits.

Wagner will be discussing some of the alternative uses the Ohio Corn Growers are pursuing with their checkoff funds.
