MOUNT JOY (Lancaster Co.) An official of Atlantic Dairy Cooperative (ADC) told dairy farmers they must always keep in mind that they are producing a food for consumption and suggested that they not put milk in the tank from which they would not want their family to drink.

Don Breiner, field and lab services manager, was the featured speaker at the ADC dinner meeting Thursday for the Donegal and Lititz locals. Breiner enumerated various points that can cause large deductions in score on the farm sanitary inspection program. Since everyone in a bulk tank unit loses certification if individual farms draw down the total score, it is imperative that every farm meet the standards.

Items on the score sheet in which dairy persons can lose a large number of points include:

• The milk house. If the milk house is not clean and neat, it is a reflection on the total operation. • The milking equipment. Everything milk touches must be squeaky clean. Equipment must be

smooth and sanitized. You can't sanitize a rough surface; therefore, you lose 10 points just on these two items.

 Cows must have clean flanks and udders. You can't produce clean milk any other way.

• Medicines must be properly labeled and properly stored. Many of the requirements are consumerdriven.

"Many people feel that a number of items on the inspection sheet have very little or nothing to do with producing milk, and therefore should not be included in an inspection, rating, or spot-check," Breiner said. "But producing milk does not only include the quality of the milk produced. Conditions in (Turn to Page A39)



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




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
