ASCS Provides Premeasurement Service

LEESPORT (Berks Co.) -Richard Troutman, chairman of the Berks County Stabilization and Conservation Service, said premeasurement and other land measurement services are available to assure producers that they are in compliance with the 1993 farm program requirements and eligible for program benefits.

At the request of producers, ASCS will measure, stake, and reference any type of acreage, or portions thereof, prior to planting. "We can also advise producers

of fields which already have an official acreage," Troutman said. Only those acres premeasured

by ASCS will be guaranteed for DAIRY PROMOTION PROGR

the 1993 program year, he said. Fees vary, based on the type of service rendered.

To be certain that program requirements are met, producers must plant within the stakes that are placed when the land is premeasured, and also report their crop acreage to ASCS after planted.

The 1993 farm program sign-up begins March 1. To qualify for target price protection and price support loans, producers must reduce their acreage bases by 10 percent for corn and five percent for grain sorghum. There is zero acreage reduction for wheat, oats, and barley.

"Premeasurement is important

in helping farmers plan the amount of land to devote to the acreage conservation reserve (ACR) and planted acreages of program crops," Troutman said.

Farmers interested in using premeasurement service, or in obtaining information on other producer services, should contact Donna Kline at the local ASCS office.

Wolff Urges Yes Vote **On Vegetable Referendum**


Program. The referendum will give vegetable producers an opportunity to vote on the continuation of the Program for an additional five years.

gin on March 22, 1993, and end on April 9, 1993. Counting of the ballots will begin at 10 a.m. Wednesday, April 14, 1993, in the State Agriculture Building in Harrisburg, PA.
