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All columns shall be Rigidply Rafters' "Glu-Lam Columns," manufactured of foundation grade #2 southern yellow pine. The laminations shall be glued together at 12% moisture content with waterproof phenol-resorcinal glue. They shall be assembled and ciamped under pressure in a controlled environment until the glue is cured.

The columns shall be CCA pressure treated to a .60 retention factor, a minimum of 12° above the ground line on the ground contact end. The columns shall meet the following test procedures: Block Shear Test, Cyclic Delamination Test, Finger Joint Test and A.S.T.M. D905-49.



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
