
## Penn State Cows Rank High

UNIVERSITY PARK (Centre Co.) — The American Simmental Association (ASA) recently designated one of the cows from Penn State's herd with an Excellent and one with a Superior Award. The awards recognize outstanding Simmental and Simbrah females. The cow awards are based on data gathered through ASA's extensive performance testing programs using the cow's lifetime Most Probable Producing Ability (MPPA). This formula evaluates the animal's within-herd performance as shown by the weaning

weights of her calves, compared to the herd average, and projects her probable future production.

To quality for an ASA Cow Award, a cow must produce outstanding calves at regular intervals. Excellent awards are based on two consecutive calves, and Superior awards result from four consecutive progeny.

Not only do the owner and breeder of award winning cows receive recognition, but the award designation is carried on subsequent registration certificates and other reports.

According to the relase, the quality of past animals being marketed through the association sale has been good.




