Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was slow and disappointing. Offerings were fully adequate, instances ample. Live supplies were moderate. Weights were mixed and mostly desirable. Processing schedules remained heavy despite some plants reducing operations. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 49 to 61 cents; however, some plants reported discounting to stimulate demand. In the parts complex, breast items were about adequate and in best balance. Leg items ranged fully adequate to heavy, parti-cularly leg quarters. Wings were adequate to fully adequate. 


