DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY

WHEAT PRICES TURNED LOWER ON CONTINUED SLOWED EXPORT DEMAND AND CREDIT PROBLEMS IN RUSSIA; CORN PRICES FRAC-TIONALLY HIGHER ON POSSIBLITY FOR NEW RUSSIAN CREDITS AND LOWER ESTIMATE FOR BRAZILIAN CROP; BEAN PRICES MIXED, WHEAT 1 TO 7 CENTS LOWER. CORN UNCHANGED TO 1 CENT HIGHER. SORGHUM UNCHANGED TO 1 CENT HIGHER. SOYBEANS UNCHANGED TO 1 CENT LOWER. SEVERAL OFFERS ON EXPORT BOOKS BUT NO SUBSTANTIAL BUYS TO REPORT PUSHED WHEAT PRICES LOWER. RUSSIAN CREDIT PROBLEMS CON-TINUED BUT IDEAS THEY MAY RECEIVE SOME CREDITS LIMITED PRICE DECLINES. CORN PRICES FIR-MER ON REPORTS BRAZILIAN CROP ESTIMATE WAS LOWERED DUE TO POLLINATION PROBLEMS IN SOME AREAS. THIS STRENGTHENED PRICES BECAUSE OF TIGHT WORLD STOCKS AND THE POTENTIAL FOR ADDITIONAL RUSSIAN BUSINESS. SHORT COVERINGS ON THE BOARD SUPPORTED SOYBEAN PRICES. EVI-DENCE THAT BRAZIL'S BEAN CROP, LARGER THAN THE 823 MILLION BUSHELS REPORTED, HAS ENTERED TRADE CHANNELS, BOOSTED PRICES. LACK OF NEW EXPORT INTERESTS ADDED SOME PRESSURE TO SOYBEAN PRICES.






