## Landowners To Meet

WATERFORD (Erie Co.) — The Pennsylvania Landowners' Association (PLA) is hosting an educational/informational meeting regarding abusive wetland regulations and other land use issues on March 15, 7 p.m. at the Farm and Home Center of Lancaster County.

PLA will offer a videotape presentation regarding wetlands and will also briefly address scenic river designations and their impacts upon land use.

Guest speaker for the meeting will be Congressman Tom Ridge (PA-21), who is co-author of H.R. 1330, the Comprehensive Wetlands Conservation and Management Act, which has been the most comprehensive and widely supported wetlands legislation introduced. "Comprehensive wetland reform is long over-due," stated Rhonda McAtee, PLA executive director.

"Landowners, both large and small, have suffered immeasurably from confiscatory wetland regulations and over zealous bureaucrats consumed with power," she said.

Bill Ellen, an environmental engineer and the government's latest wetland victim was sentenced in November of 1992 to 6 months in a federal penitentiary for creating waterfowl ponds on formerly dry land.

"This was property declared uplands until the bureaucrats, not our elected officials, took it upon themselves to add millions of acres to the wetland rosters by changing the definition of wetlands in 1989," McAtee stated. "Travesties such as this must stop," she said.

A question and answer period will be available for landowners and concerned citizens to ask the Congressman about his future agenda on property rights issues and his plans to bring regulatory agencies under control within the commonwealth.

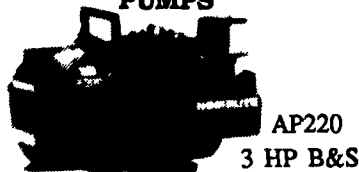

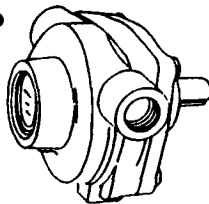
