DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES LOST RECENT GAINS ON AMPLE MOISTURE IN WHEAT GROWING AREAS, FUND SELLING ON THE BOARD, AND LACK OF CONFIRMED RUSSIAN BUSINESS. WHEAT 1 TO 3 CENTS LOWER. CORN UNCHANGED TO 3 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 2 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 1 TO 3 CENTS LOWER. WHEAT PRICES DECLINED, PRESURED BY ADEQUATE MOISTURE IN NEW CROP WHEAT AREAS. FUND SELLING ON THE BOARD ALSO A FACTOR IN LOWER PRICES. SOME STRENGTH WAS NOTED, HOWEVER, ON JAPAN AND EGYPT'S LARGE WHEAT PURCHASES. CORN AND BEAN PRICES FELL ON WEAKNESS IN WHEAT PITS AND LACK OF CONFIRMED RUSSIAN BUSINESS OR OTHER EXPORT DEMAND.
