The program features a combination of group sessions for all livestock producers, demonstrations/activities, a keynote address and breakout sessions of special interest to each group of producers. The morning program will open at 9:30 a.m. with an update from Penn State's Dr. Lowell Wilson on "Projecting a Positive Image of the Livestock Industry." Dr. Wilson will provide suggestions livestock producers can follow to deal with animal welfare/animal rights concerns. Environmental issues are increasingly important to livestock producers and have costs associated with them.
