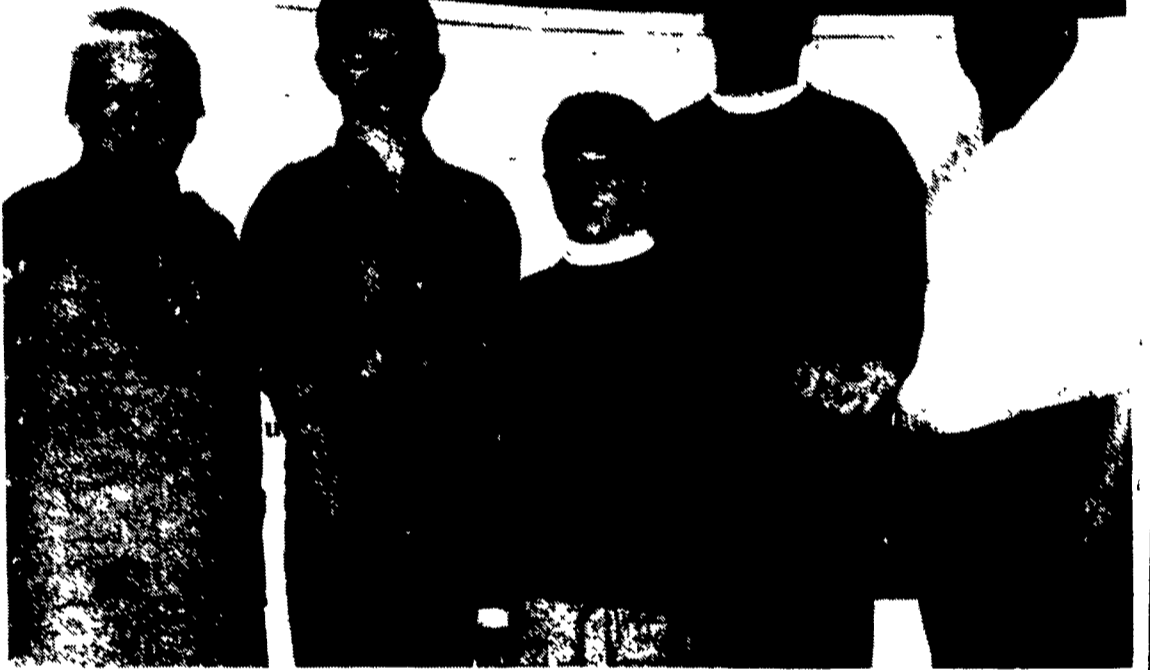

The state winners will represent Pennsylvania at National 4-H Club Congress held this December in Chicago.

A total of 28 Adams County 4-H members entered the county competition for 14-18 year olds.
