DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY RUSSIAN AID PACKAGE BECOMING OLD NEWS BUT REMAINS THE MAIN INFLUENCE FOR PRICE STRENGTH. PROFIT TAK-ING ON THE BOARD AHEAD OF TODAY'S USDA STOCKS AND ACREAGE REPORT THE NEGATIVE FORCE. WHEAT 1 TO 12 CENTS LOW-ER. CORN UNCHANGED TO 1 CENT HIGHER. SORGHUM UNCHANGED TO 2 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS MOSTLY 1 TO 2 CENTS HIGHER. WHEAT PRICES DECLINED, ESPE-CIALLY SOFT WHEAT PRICES, PRES-SURED BY SPREAD LIQUIDATION IN AN ATTEMPT TO NARROW RECENT WIDE RANGES. SLIGHT GAINS IN CORN PRICES DUE TO EXPECTATIONS OF MORE RUSSIAN DONA-TIONS AND IMPROVED EXPORT INTEREST FROM OTHERS. UPTURN IN CORN PRICES WERE LIMITED, HOWEVER, BY INCREASE IN FAR-MER SELLING OVERNIGHT AND SOME PROFIT TAKING AHEAD OF USDA'S STOCKS AND ACREAGE REPORT TO BE RELEASED TODAY. SOYBEAN PRICES FINISHED SLIGHTLY HIGHER ON HOPES PRES-IDENT CLINTONS WILL ANNOUNCE NEW AID PACKAGE TO RUSSIA BY SUNDAY. RECENT CENCUS BUREAU REPORT SHOWED EDIBLE OIL USAGE UP 4 PERCENT FROM A YEAR AGO ALSO BOOSTED PRICES. ANTI-CIPATION FOR STOCKS AND ACREAGE FIGURES LIMITED GAINS. USDA'S PROSPECTIVE PLANT-


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
