
"What we would like to have is a tax on income versus a tax on real estate. Real estate is not liquid money," said Curtis Kratz, state director of PFA district 3, at the Chester-Delaware County Farmers' Association annual spring banquet Thursday night at the West Fallowfield Christian School.

Kratz told the more than 100 farmer members present that there is "movement afoot" to have local tax reform throughout the state,

Roy Romberger, regional organization director, said they have looked at Act 319 in other counties and are studying ways to implement it affectively and fairly in Chester County. An open session by the county board of commissioners is scheduled on Tuesday to review action. To learn more about Act 319, farmers are urged to attend the meeting.






