Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was generally moderate to occasionally better for the limited supplies of lighter sizes. Supplies were adequate. Weights were desirable to mostly heavy. Live supplies were moderate. Processing schedules were heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 48 - 57 cents. Trade sentiment was generally steady. In the parts complex, demand for wings improved for immediate, some interest in leg quarters was noted for future shipments, and the balance of items were at least steady.

Trading was reported at higher prices and the undertone was fully steady. Line run breasts were adequate and most product cleared the market at steady prices. A little extra buying activity was noted early this morning but not enough to


