NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE: Prices to retailers were unchanged to lower in the Northeast and Midwest, and prices to producers, distributors and breakers were generally lower. The market tone was barely steady to weak. Carton egg demand was moderate to very good, best where featured. Supplies were at least adequate, and surplus eggs traded at discounts. Breakers received adequate supplies of shell eggs from regular sources, the undertone was barely steady to weak, and most plants planned reduced schedules. Light type fowl offerings were at least adequate for the light to moderate demand, and the undertone was barely steady to weak.

DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY LATEST NEWS ON POSSIBLE IMMEDIATE RELEASE OF FOOD AID PACKAGE TO RUSSIA CAUSED SHARP TURN AROUND IN GRAIN PRICES, ESPECIALLY CORN AND BEAN PRICES. WHEAT UNCHANGED TO 2 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 1 TO 5 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM 1 TO 4 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 6 TO 8 CENTS HIGHER. REPORTS THAT ALL 700 MILLION DOLLARS OF THE RUSSIAN FOOD AID PACKAGE MAY BE RELEASED AT ONE TIME RATHER THAN OVER SEVEN MONTH PERIOD PUT SUPPORT BACK INTO GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES. THE PL480 PROGRAM RATHER THAN EXPORT ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM IS EXPECTED TO PROVIDE A QUICKER DISPERSAL OF THE AID PACKAGE. ADDITIONAL DONATIONS AND SALE OF WHEAT TO ROMANIA ALSO BOOSTED WHEAT PRICES. SOME WEAKNESS WAS NOTED IN WHEAT PRICES DUE TO FEARS THAT LESS WHEAT MAY BE NEEDED FOR RUSSIA THAN HOPED. WET WEATHER IN MIDWEST AREAS THOUGHT TO DELAY CORN PLANTING PUSHED CORN PRICES HIGHER. SLOW COUNTRY SELLING AS WELL AS RUSSIAN AID NEWS INFLUENCED PRICE UP TURN. IDEAS MORE SOYMEAL THAN EXPECTED WILL BE INCLUDED IN AID PACKAGE ALSO A

FACTOR FOR INCREASE IN BEAN PRICES.

EXPORT NEWS: ROMANIA BOUGHT 67,000 TONNES U.S. WHEAT UNDER PL480 FOOD AID AGREEMENT FOR FISCAL 1993. ROMANIA BOUGHT 100,000 METRIC TONS HARD RED WINTER WHEAT FOR 93 MARKETING YEAR. MEXICO BOUGHT 475 TONNES SUNOIL UNDER THE SUNFLOWERSEED OIL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FOR MAY SHIPMENT.
