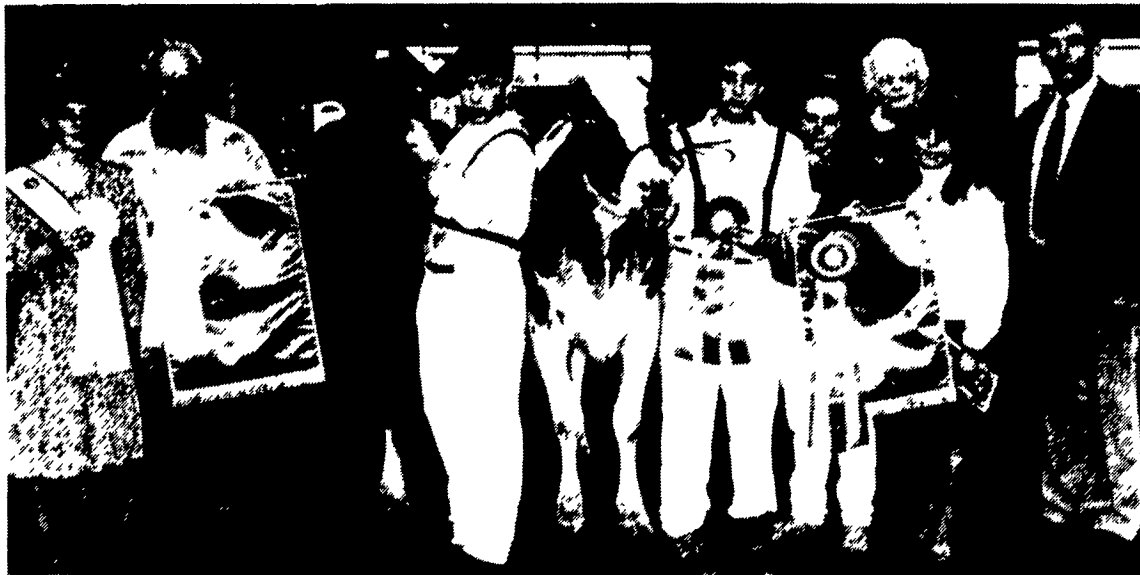
The trip to the national dairy bowl contest is supported by the Maryland Holstein Association, Frederick County Association and Carroll County Association. Contributions are still being accepted.
