GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES WERE MOSTLY LOWER, WEDNESDAY, ON WARMER, DRIER WEATHER FORECAST FOR MOST OF U.S. DURING NEXT TWO WEEKS AND FUND SELLING IN BEAN PITS. WHEAT 1 TO 4 CENTS LOWER. CORN 2 TO 6 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 3 TO 4 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS MIXED. OUTLOOK FOR WARM, DRY WEATHER CONDITIONS TO MOVE INTO MIDWEST AREAS WITHIN THE NEXT COUPLE WEEKS PRESSURED GRAIN AND BEAN PRICES. WINTER WHEAT CROP GROWTH WILL BENEFIT AND ALLOW FIELDWORK TO BEGIN PREPARATION FOR PLANTING. SOYBEAN PRICES WERE LOWER IN REACTION TO DECLINES IN CORN PRICES AND FUND SELLING ON THE BOARD. USDA'S SUPPLY AND DEMAND REPORT RELEASED MONDAY, FORECASTED 92-93 ENDING BEAN STOCKS AT 340 MILLION BUSHELS CONTINUED TO WEIGH ON SOYBEAN PRICES. ADDITIONAL WEAKNESS STEMMED FROM REPORTS BRAZIL'S BEAN HARVEST GOING WELL EXPORT INTEREST ADDED SLIGHT SUPPORT TO BEAN PRICES

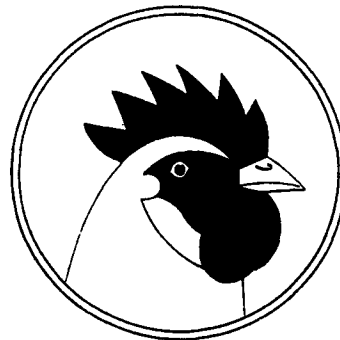
