tance due to the . . . I guess, unknown."

Hand said that while the groups such as Jeremy Rifkin's, which are conducting scare campaigns, are not helping to bring about a wide rational understanding of BST, the perception by the public is ultimately what drives retail sales.

"As far as we're concerned, (the BST-fear propaganda) is a misre-

presentation, but at least perception is reality and we have to deal with the reality that consumers were motivated in a negative way to resist a product that contained the so-called supplemental BST.

"We also felt that this would be a short time thing, but a major resistance in the milk supply has severe negative impacts on farmers — even if short term.

"You don't get it back," Hand said about opportunities to sell

milk. "If you don't sell it today, it's gone."

Hand said that under the circumstances, calling for the moratorium was the only thing the cooperative could do right now, in response to the request from a major buyer of milk.

"Given that entire reaction and feeling and desire of . . . milk buyers and customers, a wait and see period would be better at this time."

Hand said that ADC intends to keep the policy until the threat of lost sales is gone.

"There is no time limit. I guess

we're going by the old adage, 'Be not the first by whom the new is tried, nor yet the last to lay the old aside.'"

Hand said that the cooperative has a duty first to its members, BST users or not.

"We legally feel we have the responsibility to market the milk of our members. We do have customers, who at least at this point, don't insist on a 'BST-free' supply," he said about the possibility of marketing some cooperative milk that may eventually come from cows treated with supplemental BST.

For the time being, however, the

cooperative is publicly staying clear of endorsing BST. "If we tell a customer that our producers aren't using BST, we owe them that. On the other hand, if it is legal, we are going to use all the persuasive tools to introduce in an orderly way the new technology," he said.

The cooperative-wide moratorium is a better way to deal with the issue, according to Hand, because it is unified.

"This is one of the steps to have an area-wide approach to BST, as opposed to having each co-op doing its own thing."
