Credit Repair

NEWARK, DE - Consumers with poor financial histories are often lured by too-good-to-be-true offers of instant credit repair, says Maria Pippidis, University of Delaware Cooperative Extension home economics agent.

"Companies that promise to clean up your credit record for a price are out to take you," Pippidis says. "A good credit rating can't be bought- it must be earned. However, under federal law you have the right to attach statements of explanation to your credit record. You can do this yourself simply by writing to the major credit bureaus."

Protect yourself against fraudulent credit-repair offers, the agent says, by taking these precautions:

•Be suspicious when you are told that accurate information will

PICKLED CUCUMBER FOR **SATAY**

4 cups peeled/sliced cucumber (small pieces) Add:

1 cup diced onions

½ cup sugar

14 cup white vinegar

4 pieces cloves

4 pieces allspice Hot pepper, if desired Jalapeno pepper, if desired

Carrot, diced, if desired Red pepper, if desired

Fish sauce, to taste Curry powder, to taste

Combine ingredients. (No need to boil vinegar and sugar if the dish is eaten the same day, but do boil if stored in the refrigerator overnight). Cloves and allspice are used whole and removed before serving. Cover and refrigerate several hours before serving.

SATAY SAUCE

1 cup unsalted peanuts

1 cup coconut milk 1 tablespoon curry powder

1/2 cup fish sauce

½ cup sugar

Chinese shallots

Grind together all ingredients. Add about ½ cup water, after using it to rinse out mixer/grinder and add the chicken stock used to make chicken satay. Simmer on low temperature for about 1 hour. Add water if sauce is drying out. Makes about 2 cups sauce. Stir every 10 minutes as peanuts tend to sink to the bottom.

CHICKEN SATAY

pounds chicken white meat

(cut in large chunks)

1 tablespoon curry powder 2 tablespoons fish sauce

1/2 cup coconut milk

1 tablespoon sugar

Mix together all ingredients. (Nipa often boils the chicken in water for tenderness before she mixes it with the other ingredients. Reserve the chicken stock for satay sauce). Set aside in refrigerator for 20 minutes. Remove the chicken, skewer and place in baking tray, turn on broiler. Broil chicken for 5 minutes, turn over, broil for another 3 minutes. Do not over broil. (Do not bake chicken or it will become tough). Serve with Satay Sauce.
