

CHAMBERSBURG (Franklin Co.) — A scholarship to the Conservation Leadership School will be provided by the Franklin County Conservation District to a county student between the ages of 15-18 who have completed at least one ninth-grade science course.

The schools are scheduled for July 4-July 17 and July 18-31, at the Civil Engineering Camp at Penn State's rustic Stone Valley recreation areas. Students stay in platform tents with bunks and concrete floors and use the Civil Engineering Lodge and heated bathhouses.

Cost of attending this school is \$370. The district pays \$100, which includes lodging and all meals, course materials, etc. The student is responsible for their own transportation to and from Stone Valley in Huntington County.

The curriculum focuses on the application of principles of forestry, wildlife management, soils management, watershed management, architecture, and other areas of conservation. Note: This is not a recreational summer camp - students-should have a strong desire to learn. Dr. James Hamilton heads a staff of resident instructors, all with academic backgrounds and experience in the aforementioned subjects.

This essay is a must to determine who will attend this school in the event there is more than one application.




