DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY WHEAT PRICES FELL MODERATELY ON WINTER WHEAT CROP'S BUMPER YIELD POTENTIAL. CORN PRICES FRACTIONALLY HIGHER ON EXPORT DEMAND. PROSPECTS FOR BUSINESS WITH RUSSIA AND POSSIBILITY FOR RAINFALL STILL LURKING IN MID-WEST AREA FORECASTS. SOYBEAN PRICES CONTINUED LOWER DUE TO ACTIVE SELLING, LIGHT EXPORT DEMAND, AND CONCERNS OVER ARGENTINE BEAN HARVEST GETTING UNDERWAY. WHEAT 2 TO 9 CENTS LOWER. CORN UNCHANGED TO 1 CENT HIGHER. SORGHUM 1 TO 4 CENTS HIGHER. SOY-BEANS 2 TO 3 CENTS LOWER. WHEAT BASIS FELL ON OLD CROP BUT NEW CROP WHEAT PRICES HIGHER. SOME AREAS REPORTED TO BE TWO WEEKS BEHIND IN DEVELOPMENT BUT CROP SEEMS TO BE IN GOOD SHAPE. WINTER WHEAT LOOKING VERY GOOD AND BUMPER YIELDS ANTICIPATED. CORN PRICES TURNED SLIGHTLY HIGHER **BOOSTED BY TAIWAN'S PURCHASE** AND HOPES FOR UPCOMING RUS-SIAN BUSINESS. CONTINUED DELAYS IN CORN PLANTING SUP-PORTED PRICES BUT FARMERS OPTIMISTIC IF DRY CONDITIONS CONTINUE. BEAN PRICES WERE PRESSURED LOWER ON ACTIVE FUND SELLING ON THE BOARD AND REPORTS THAT ARGENTINA BEGIN-NING HARVEST. CONCERNS ABOUT INCREASED SOYBEAN ACRES PLANTED DUE TO CORN PLANTING DELAYS ALSO ADDED WEAKNESS
