DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY WHEAT PRICES FELL MODERATELY ON WINTER WHEAT CROP'S BUMPER YIELD POTENTIAL. CORN PRICES FRACTIONALLY HIGHER ON EXPORT DEMAND. PROSPECTS FOR BUSINESS WITH RUSSIA AND POSSIBILITY FOR RAINFALL STILL LURKING IN MID-WEST AREA FORECASTS. SOYBEAN PRICES CONTINUED LOWER DUE TO ACTIVE SELLING, LIGHT EXPORT DEMAND, AND CONCERNS OVER ARGENTINE BEAN HARVEST GETTING UNDERWAY. WHEAT 2 TO 9 CENTS LOWER. CORN UNCHANGED TO 1 CENT HIGHER. SORGHUM 1 TO 4 CENTS HIGHER. SOY-BEANS 2 TO 3 CENTS LOWER. WHEAT BASIS FELL ON OLD CROP BUT NEW CROP WHEAT PRICES HIGHER. SOME AREAS REPORTED TO BE TWO WEEKS BEHIND IN DEVELOPMENT BUT CROP SEEMS TO BE IN GOOD SHAPE. WINTER WHEAT LOOKING VERY GOOD AND BUMPER YIELDS ANTICIPATED. CORN PRICES TURNED SLIGHTLY HIGHER BOOSTED BY TAIWAN'S PURCHASE AND HOPES FOR UPCOMING RUSSIAN BUSINESS. CONTINUED DELAYS IN CORN PLANTING SUPPORTED PRICES BUT FARMERS OPTIMISTIC IF DRY CONDITIONS CONTINUE. BEAN PRICES WERE PRESSURED LOWER ON ACTIVE FUND SELLING ON THE BOARD AND REPORTS THAT ARGENTINA BEGINNING HARVEST. CONCERNS ABOUT INCREASED SOYBEAN ACRES PLANTED DUE TO CORN PLANTING DELAYS ALSO ADDED WEAKNESS TO PRICES.

EXPORT NEWS: JAPAN BOUGHT 75,188 TONNES WHEAT FOR JUNE SHIPMENT. TAIWAN BOUGHT 148,000 METRIC TONS CORN; 36,000 TONNES FOR 92/93 MARKETING YEAR AND 112,000 TONNES FOR 93/94. TAIWAN BOUGHT 54,000 TONNES U.S. NO. 2 YELLOW CORN FOR JUNE/JULY SHIPMENT. TAIWAN BOUGHT 17,000 TONNES U.S. NO. 2 YELLOW SOYBEANS FOR MID-JUNE. USDA ACCEPTED AT BID TO SELL 3,000 TONNES SUNOIL TO MEXICO UNDER THE SUNFLOWERSEED OIL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FOR JUNE/JULY SHIPMENT.

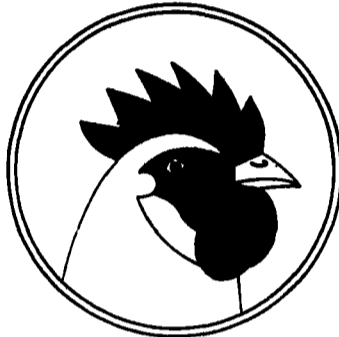
