ATTENTION DODGE CITY** OKLAHOMA NATIONAL STOCK-YARDS WEEKLY CATTLE SUM-MARY: Compared To Last Week: Peeder steers 600-800 lbs. steady to \$1.00 lower, over 800 lbs. firm. Feeder heifers steady to \$2.00 higher. Stocker steers and heifers firm. Demand good to moderate with moderately active trading. Quality of stockers and feeders average thru attractive. Feeder cattle flesh continues to increase each week with majority now in slightly fleshy to moderately fleshy wheat condition. Feeder weigh-ups average to full. Stockers in average to thin condition but overall not as thin as last week. Stocker weigh-ups gaunt to full. Slaughter cows \$1.00 lower under moderate demand. Slaughter bulls steady. Receipts this week 12,200; last week 8,914; last year 13,636. Supply consisted of 84% feeders and stockers over 600 lbs.; 12% calves and light yearlings under 600 lbs.; 4% cows and bulls. Bulk price ranges follow with weighted averages in parenthesis.


