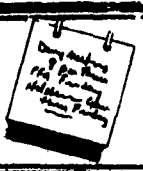

UNIVERSITY PARK (Centre Co.)—At the Penn State Board of Trustees meeting on Thursday, two well-known agricultural leaders seek election: David Morrow, DVM, PHD, from State College, and Gordon Hiller, state Grange master from Williamsport.

Morrow currently serves on the board as vice-chairman of the physical plant committee and as a member of the educational policy committee. He previously served as vice chairman of the Hershey Medical Center committee and member of the finance committee.

Morrow is an active participant in university activities as a trustee and as an alumnus. He has edited an annual newsletter for the agricultural community on behalf of all the trustees representing agriculture and is past president of the College of Agricultural Sciences Alumni Society and is president of the 117,000 member University Alumni Association. Recent Penn State honors include the distinguished alumnus award from the department of dairy and animal science and honorary memberships in Golden Key National Honor Society and Lion Ambassadors, the Penn State student alumni corps.

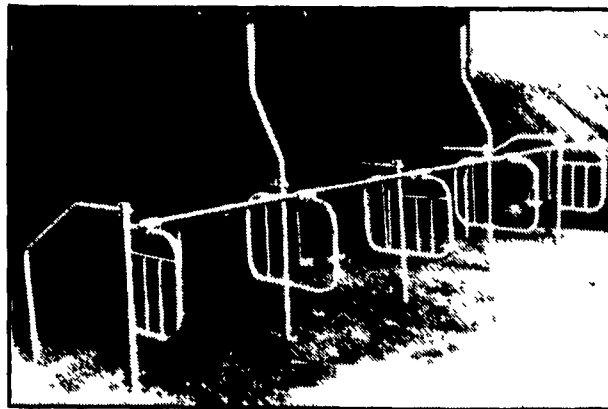

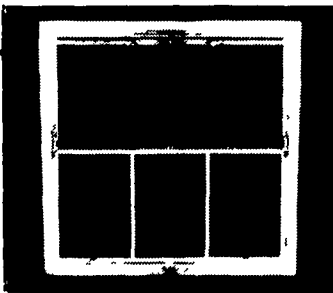
Lapp Comfort Tie Stall
